### ADDITIONAL COURSES ADDED

The Department of Political Science is looking to fill the following sessional instructor positions (subject to funding) in the Political Science Program. Fall session runs from September 10<sup>th</sup>– December 7<sup>th</sup> 2018 and winter session runs from January 9<sup>th</sup> to April 12<sup>th</sup> 2019.

#### Fall Term 2018

##### **POLI 381 L02: Introduction to International Relations (Tuesdays 1700 – 1945)**

An introduction to the central concepts, problems, and approaches that comprise the field of comparative politics. Emphasis may also be placed on key analytical challenges, competing methods, and basic governance systems in selected parts of the world.

#### Winter Term 2019

##### **POLI 402 L01: Advanced Topics in Politics (MWF 1500 - 1550)**

Advanced examination of an emerging topic in Political Science with a Canadian Politics, Comparative Politics, International Relations or Political Theory focus.

The successful candidate will have expertise in the area of Transitional Justice in international and comparative perspective. Transitional justice refers to the political, legal, and ethical dimensions of states and societies coming to terms with past atrocities and human rights violations.

The application deadline is **4:00 p.m. July 13<sup>th</sup>, 2018**.

Applicants should provide a letter specifying the course(s) and session(s) of interest, their qualifications to teach each course, and any scheduling constraints that would need to be taken into consideration.

Applicants who have taught in the Department within the past two years need not provide anything further. Other applicants should include the following with their letter:

- a current CV;
- name and contact information for 3 potential referees; and
- teaching evaluations (if available).

Doctoral students must have successfully completed their candidacy exams prior to the beginning of the term in question for their applications to be given consideration. They should also have discussed their application with their supervisor and include a letter of support from them with their application. Those who have completed the Instructional Skills Workshop at the Teaching and Learning Centre will also be given special consideration.

**Note:** Courses that do not reach enrolment requirements will be cancelled. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
