

SESSIONAL INSTRUCTOR OPPORTUNITIES 2019

The Department of Political Science is looking to fill the following sessional instructor positions (subject to funding) for the International Indigenous Studies Program. Spring session runs from May 6th – June 21st and summer session runs from July 2nd - August 19th, 2019.

Spring Term 2019

INDG 201: Introduction to Indigenous Studies (MW 1200-1445)

A multi-disciplinary, theoretical and empirical overview of the situations, perspectives, and aspirations of selected Indigenous peoples with a focus on the Canadian context.

INDG 312: Cult Immersion Field Course (BLOCK WEEK COURSE)

Experience of ceremonial and cultural activities, with a focus on four themes: living values; spirituality; health and healing; and roles, responsibilities, and respect.

INDG 397: Special Topics in Canadian Indigenous Study (Tu/Thr 1200-1445)

Selected themes in Canadian Indigenous studies.

Summer Term 2019

INDG 303: Indigenous Ways of Knowing I (Tu/Thr 1200 – 1445)

An introduction to various Indigenous peoples ways of knowing (epistemology) with a special emphasis on the contextualization of knowledge building. Deals with various aspects of building knowledge, such as listening, reflection, protocol, and experience.

INDG 399: Special Topics in International Indigenous Studies (MW 1200 – 1445)

Selected themes in International Indigenous studies. May focus on Indigenous peoples of only one country.

The application deadline is **4:00 p.m. on Friday, February 15th, 2019.**

Applicants should provide a letter specifying the course(s) and session(s) of interest, their qualifications to teach each course, a list of and dates for all courses previously taught at the University of Calgary and any scheduling constraints that would need to be taken into consideration. For special topics courses, please submit a statement of interest indicating the specific topic and brief description of the proposed focus for the course.

Applicants who have taught in the program within the past two years need not provide anything further. Other applicants should include the following with their letter:

- a current CV;
- name and contact information for 3 potential referees; and
- teaching evaluations (if available).

Note: Courses that do not reach enrolment requirements will be cancelled. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
