

SESSIONAL INSTRUCTOR OPPORTUNITIES 2017-2018

The Department of Political Science is looking to fill the following sessional instructor positions (subject to funding) in the Political Science Program. Fall session runs from September 11th – December 8th 2017 and winter session runs from January 8th to April 13th 2018.

Fall Term 2017

POLI 283 L01: Issues and Trends in World Politics (Tu/Thr 1400-1515)

Major trends and issues in world politics, such as international tensions, migration, ethnic conflicts, human rights and sustainable development.

Winter Term 2018

POLI 381 L01 Introduction to International Relations (Tu/Thr 1400-1515)

The structures and processes of international relations and foreign policy.

POLI 481 L01 The Powers of Human Rights (MWF 1000-1050)

An analysis of the origins, evolution, and contemporary politics of human rights. Topics may include the philosophic and religious roots of human rights; international and domestic human rights laws; and struggles to promote and protect human rights in specific contexts around the world.

The application deadline is **4:00 p.m. July 20th 2017**.

Applicants should provide a letter specifying the course(s) and session(s) of interest, their qualifications to teach each course, and any scheduling constraints that would need to be taken into consideration.

Applicants who have taught in the Department within the past two years need not provide anything further. Other applicants should include the following with their letter:

- a current CV;
- name and contact information for 3 potential referees; and
- teaching evaluations (if available).

Doctoral students must have successfully completed their candidacy exams prior to the beginning of the term in question for their applications to be given consideration. They should also have discussed their application with their supervisor and include a letter of support from them with their application. Those who have completed the Instructional Skills Workshop at the Teaching and Learning Centre will also be given special consideration.

Note: Courses that do not reach enrolment requirements will be cancelled. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
